Effective Tuesday, October 14 at 5 pm: All Evacuation Orders Lifted for All Canyons Near Airport Fire Burn Scar

Santa Ana, Calif. (October 14, 2025) - Effective Tuesday, October 14 at 5 pm all evacuation orders have been lifted for Trabuco Creek, Bell Canyon, Hot Springs Canyon, Long Canyon and Modjeska Canyon.

- Trabuco Creek – Mandatory – Evacuation Lifted
- Hot Springs Canyon – Mandatory – Evacuation Lifted
- Bell Canyon – Mandatory – Evacuation Lifted
- Long Canyon – Voluntary – Evacuation Lifted
- Modjeska Canyon – Voluntary – Evacuation Lifted

Road Closures

- Trabuco Canyon Road at Rose Canyon – Hard Closure Lifted
- Plano Trabuco near Robinson Ranch – Hard Closure Lifted
- Grey Rock at Bell Canyon – Hard Closure Lifted
- Hot Springs Canyon at Ortega Highway – Hard Closure Lifted
